- Speaker sets

Product Guidelines

Please note, we do not accept speakers with any minor defect in their cones or acoustic suspensions. While these defects may be considered minor, they generate a significant disturbance in the performance of the object.





For our Audio Equipment auctions, we do not accept the following objects:

- Used electron vacuum Tubes/Valves
- Spare parts
- Low standard cartridges for turntable
- Non-functional equipment
- Televisions and video equipment (Except for B&O items)
- Equipment with political propaganda (Tube radios from WW2, etc.)
- Widely available devices
- Karaoke sets
- Non-professional Public address amplification systems
- Car audio
- Replicas or fake objects are not considered by our experts
- Audio equipment that is younger than five years old

Submission Guidelines

Potential buyers are more likely to bid on objects with a good description, with all relevant information displayed clearly.



Object description

To help encourage potential buyers to bid on your object, you should include a detailed description of your object(s). This should be thorough and honest, and should follow the guidelines below.



Submission Guidelines

If you use our website to upload your objects, fields will appear to give you guidance about what information we need to know. The fields you fill in present the information in a way that's easy for the buyer to read and search by.

The required information includes:

- Brand and model name/number and type without extra descriptions such as "amazingly beautiful - very collectible", etc.
- Condition: all objects should be in very good and tested condition.
- Specifications and technical highlights are essential and they need to be specified in the "Description" area. Include details such as power handling (Watts), impedance (Ohms), harmonic distortion in (THD%), frequency range (Hz-Khz,), and dimensions (WLH).
- Weight and size please calculate the weight based on the technical specifications and packaging weight. Please remember that a speaker set consists of 2 units, while the technical information will always show the weight of 1 speaker.
- Please provide a serial number, especially for Bang & Olufsen models made after 1990 and for vintage professional audio devices.



Submission Guidelines

To ensure a successful auction, please avoid:

- Reserve price disclosure
- Shipping costs that are higher than advised
- Personal price estimations
- Using photographs from the internet or other sellers
- Adding links to external websites
- Adding copy/paste reviews
- Information that is not relevant

Please consider what you would like to know about the object you're selling.



Submission guidelines

Including strong photographs is key to catching buyers' attention, ensuring they bid on your object.

Buying online means bidders don't get a chance to see your object in person. So detailed and high-quality photographs are very important.

Photographs

To allow our experts, as well as our bidders, to get an accurate impression of your item, we need a minimum of 6 high-quality photos.





Image Guidelines

- Make sure you avoid any distracting background, such as a shop interior or outdoors.
 - Photos should show nothing else but the object(s) you want to put up for auction.
- Bidders are interested in seeing as many details as possible. Therefore, please always include images of the back, bottom, top, sides and from the inside where applicable. In case of several items, please photograph all offered objects together as well as every item separately.
- For every item, do not forget to add the following images:
 - Device while powered on (for equipments with displays or any light indicator).
 - Speaker cones and acoustic suspension (for speakers, audio sets, subwoofers, etc).
 - Detailed pictures on audio connections (RCA, DIN, XLR, MIDI, etc)
 - Serial Numbers, specifications such as voltage, version and country of manufacturing.
 - Every visible or technical flaw that the object might have.
